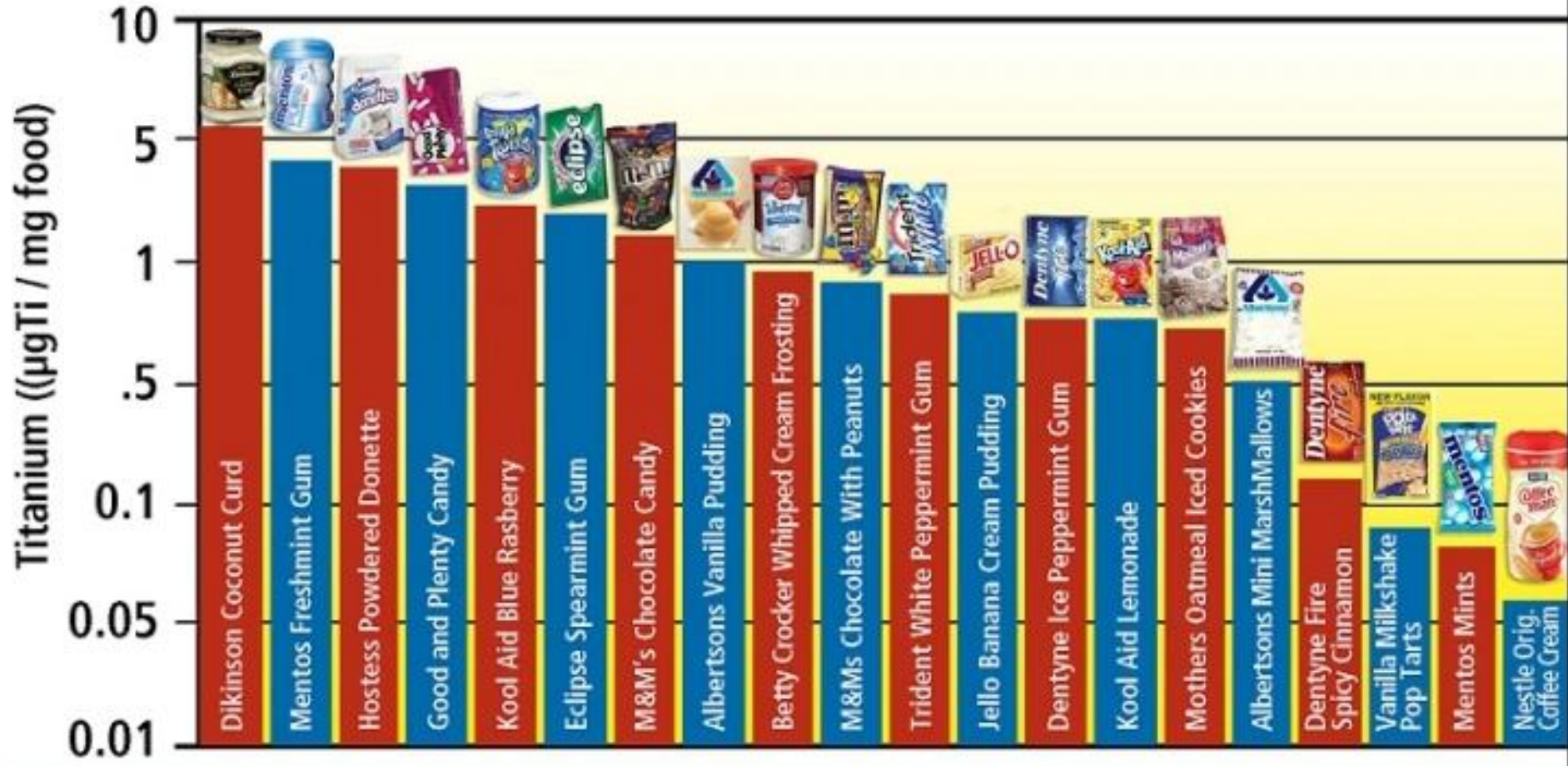
Jesus said one of the end time signs is that "*Nation shall rise against nation*". In this end time we see these prophecies coming to pass almost daily.

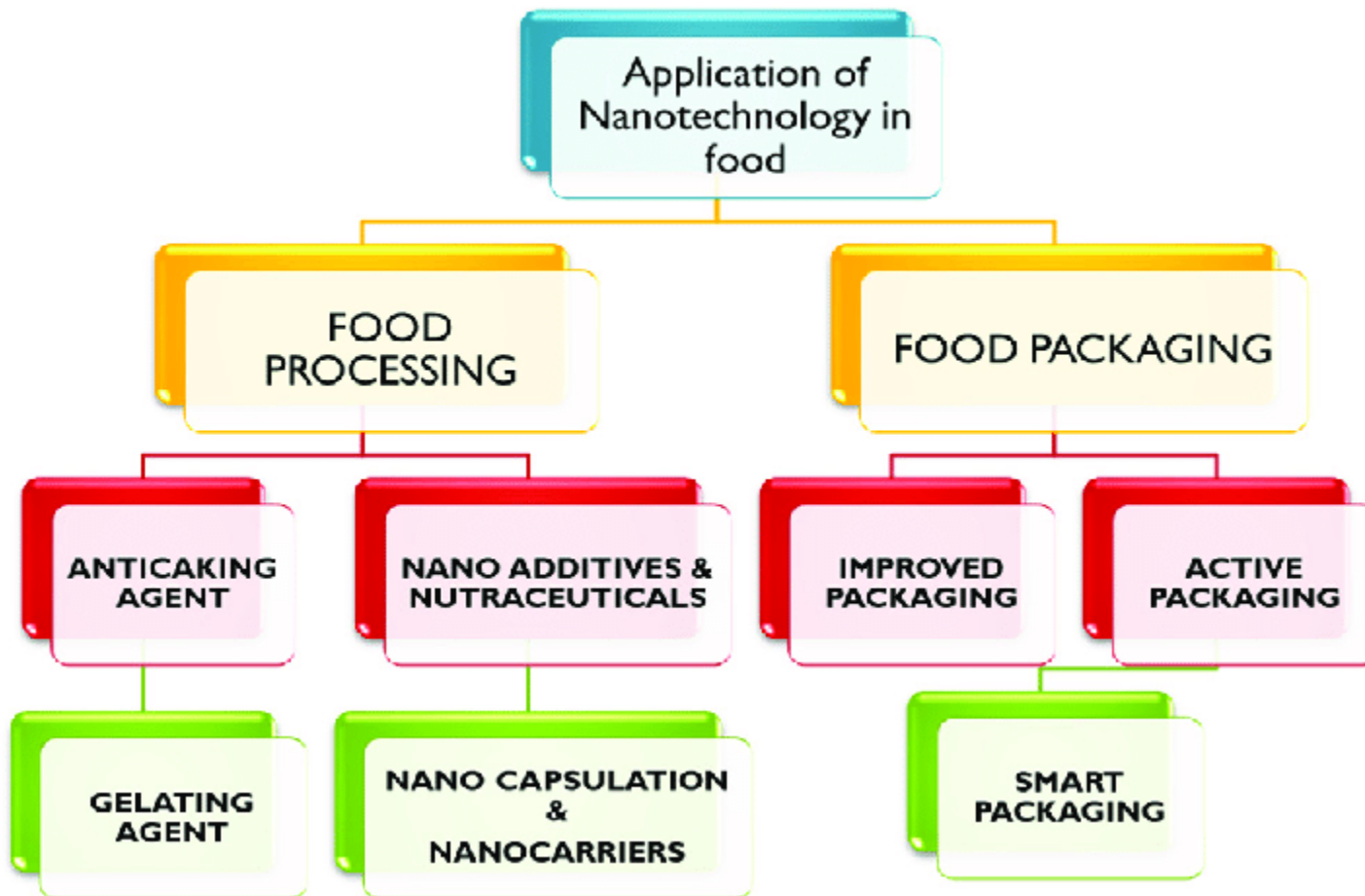
In **Mathew 24:3** *And as he sat upon the mount of Olives, the disciples came unto him privately, saying, Tell us, when shall these things be? And what shall be the sign of thy Parousia, and of the end of the world?*

Ok, so the question they were asking here is, What shall be the sign of Thy parousia, and the events which will lead up to the end of the world. So we see that although you have one long season of his Presence here, this presence will also end with the end of the world as we have known it. So Jesus gives us the answers in the next verses of Scripture.

4 And Jesus answered and said unto them, Take heed that no man deceive you.

So we see here that he begins by telling them it will be a time of Great Deception. **Take Heed that no man deceive you.** Like the germ warfare upon the people. I just found out yesterday that there are about 10 links if you look for nano technology in dentistry. The nova cane that you thought was safe is filled with nano technology that will react to 5G technology. They had a video of a microbiologist showing self-forming nano technology in all anesthetic products that are shot into your gums when they do a filling or other dental procedures. And they have put it into the sprays for lettuce and all kinds of items,





So the very first thing is that you must be on the lookout for a time when it is very deceiving. That means everywhere you turn there will be deception. Deception first he says will come in the religious realm.

5 For many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many.

Then that deception goes everywhere. First in religion, then it works into education, then government, then the media, (you know, like Tele-Vision which sounds like tell the vision, and radio, both have channels like witchcraft has channeling, and they have programming, Like religion has deprogramming, and you have to be programmed before you can be deprogrammed. But notice, this deception is that all nations shall be deceived into hating one another, and thus warring with one another. It will effect Education, they kicked Him out of the schools in the late 60;s, but first kicked the Word from the churches, Then the schools, then the Media, and then politics, and finally the medical establishment.

6 And ye shall hear of wars and rumors of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet.

So we see the First World War, and that led to the Second World War, and finally the weaponry will be such as to end in a nuclear war called World War Three.

7 For nation shall rise against nation, (That is nations, country will rise against country but then he adds) *and kingdom against kingdom:* (Now we can say these kingdoms are smaller nations but they have a king or queen involved making them different from nations.) *and then there shall be famines,* (Notice this ends with a plural “s” sound, so not just a famine but in many places.) *and pestilences,* (Those are plagues and pandemics) *and earthquakes, in divers* (many) *places. 8 All these are the beginning of sorrows.*

So today we will be looking at this seed Word that we are looking at, at this harvest time of His Word, All His Word seeds are coming to fruition and are ready for this harvest time of all Word Seeds ever sown.

From **This Day This Scripture 65-0219 P:52** God’s end-time prophet said, “**What does the Scripture say about today and about the time we live in? Jesus speaking... I won't have time to take them all, but I want to take this one 'fore we close. Jesus said in St. Luke the 17th chapter, the 30th verse, Jesus Christ, the Word Himself (Do you believe that?) - Jesus Christ, the Word Himself made flesh, spoke and said what the Word would be in the**

end time, what would be the sign of the end of the world. He told them, nation would rise against nation, but He said, "As it was in the days of Sodom, so shall it be in the day when the Son of man is being revealed."

So not only do we know and understand the warning Jesus gave us that *nation shall rise against nation*, but also he mentions in **Luke 17:30** that there will come a revealing with this parousia of Christ, and also the end time will be in a condition that will be characterized by a sodomite condition.

That is what the words, "as it was" means. "*As it was in the days of Lot down in Sodom so shall it be,*" ... "*At the time of the revealing or the revelation of the Son of Man, is when this condition throughout the world shall be,*".

And then he tells us that this revealing will come through a prophetic ministry which we see in **Malachi 4:1-6**, **Luke 17:30** and **Revelations 10:1-7**.

This Day This Scripture 65-0219 P:52 *What does the Scripture say about today and about the time we live in? Jesus speaking ... I won't have time to take them all, but I want to take this one 'fore we close. Jesus said in St. **Luke the 17th chapter, the 30th verse**, Jesus Christ, the Word Himself (Do you believe that?) - Jesus Christ, the Word Himself made flesh, spoke and said what the Word would be in the end time, what would be the sign of the end of the world. He told them nation would rise against nation, but He said, "As it was in the days of Sodom, so shall it be in the day when the Son of man is being revealed."*

Then this end time prophet told us that at this time Israel would become a nation. So that cuts out WWI and even WWII.

This is said in his sermon called **End time sign seed 62-0319 P:55** *Now. Let's take His Word then. **Hebrews 1** said, "God in sundry times and divers manners spoke to the prophets, but in this last days through his Son, Christ Jesus." Now, He was a God-prophet. He was a prophet, sure. Moses said, "**The Lord your God will raise up a prophet.**" But this was more than a prophet; He was God, manifested in flesh. Now, this God-prophet give us two or three signs that we want to look at here, great signs that we want to remember. In **Matthew 24** when it was asked Him "**When shall these things be? What will be the coming of the end of the world? When will all this take place?**" He gave so many different things that would take place: *nation shall rise against nation, kingdom against**

kingdom, and so forth, and on and on and on. But said, "Learn a parable of the fig tree when, and all the other trees."



So we are not just looking at one thing here, we want to identify as many scriptural word seed as we possibly can so that we are fully prepared for the resurrection season. We are looking at everything he said would come to blossom at the same time. But this morning we are looking at this fact that "**nation shall**

rise against nation, and kingdom against Kingdom and you would hear of wars and rumors of wars."

In **Amos, Isaiah** and **Jeremiah** we see prophecies of Damascus, Syria, and how is prophesied to be destroyed and its people scattering all over the earth. We are seeing that prophecy fulfilled even as we are speaking these words.

Amos 1:5 *I will break also the bar of Damascus, and cut off the inhabitant from the plain of Aven, and him that holdeth the sceptre from the house of Eden: and the people of Syria shall go into captivity unto Kir, saith the LORD.*



Now, this means that they will be disbursed throughout the nations. Kir was located nations away from Damascus. So we are looking at a migration of the populace of the Syrians.

Jeremiah 49:24 *Damascus is waxed feeble, and turneth herself to flee, and fear hath seized on her: anguish and sorrows have taken her, as a woman in travail.*

Isaiah 17:1 *The burden of Damascus. Behold, Damascus is taken away from being a city, and it shall be a ruinous heap.*



Nahum 3:18 *Thy shepherds slumber, O king of Assyria: thy nobles shall dwell in the dust: **thy people is scattered upon the mountains**, and no man gathereth them.*



Isaiah 27:13 *And it shall come to pass in that day, that the great trumpet shall be blown, and they shall come which were ready to perish in the land of Syria,...*



1 Thessalonians 5:3-4 *While they are saying, “Peace and safety all is well and secure!” then in a moment unforeseen destruction will come upon them suddenly like labor pains on a woman with child, and they will absolutely not escape for there will be no way to escape the judgment of the Lord. **4** But you, believers, all you who believe in Christ as Savior and acknowledge Him as God’s Son] are not in spiritual darkness +nor held by its power, that the day of judgment would overtake you by surprise like a thief;*

In one of his speeches President Trump “**We need peace, order, and safety**” He wanted to conserve the peace and safety of the world and initiated peace accords in the middle east between Israel and the Palestinians. In another speech he said while President he “announced actions to restore safety and peace in U.S. cities.” He ran as the Peace and safety President.

The **Trump peace plan**, which was dubbed the “**Abraham Accords**” as the official title went into effect by September "was an attempt by the Trump administration to finally reach peace and safety once and for all. It was a proposal by the Trump administration to resolve the Israeli–Palestinian conflict. President Donald Trump formally unveiled the plan in a White House press conference alongside Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on 28 January 2020. The plan had been delayed by finally accepted by the Palestinians,

The plan was authored by a team led by Trump's son-in-law and senior advisor Jared Kushner. The plan is divided into two parts, an economic portion and a political portion. On 22 June 2019, the Trump administration released the economic portion of the plan, titled "**Peace** to Prosperity". The political portion was released in late January 2020.

The Likud spokesman tweeted that Israeli sovereignty over settlements would be declared on the following Sunday. Even trump moved our embassy to Jerusalem.


Of the Seven major Visions William Branham had in 1933, all but one is fulfilled, and the sixth one will be fulfilled due to the rigging of the presidential vote of 2016.



The Biden administration has since ignored this peace plan and turned their direction to war in Ukraine against Russia. So you can see who is the Peace and Safety administration and who is the Party of war. But in the Last days there has been pockmarks of conflicts from nation to Nation. We have had WW1, WW2, Korean war, Vietnam war, Middle East war, Dessert storm, Syrian war, Ethiopia, Myanmar, Ukraine war. Etc.



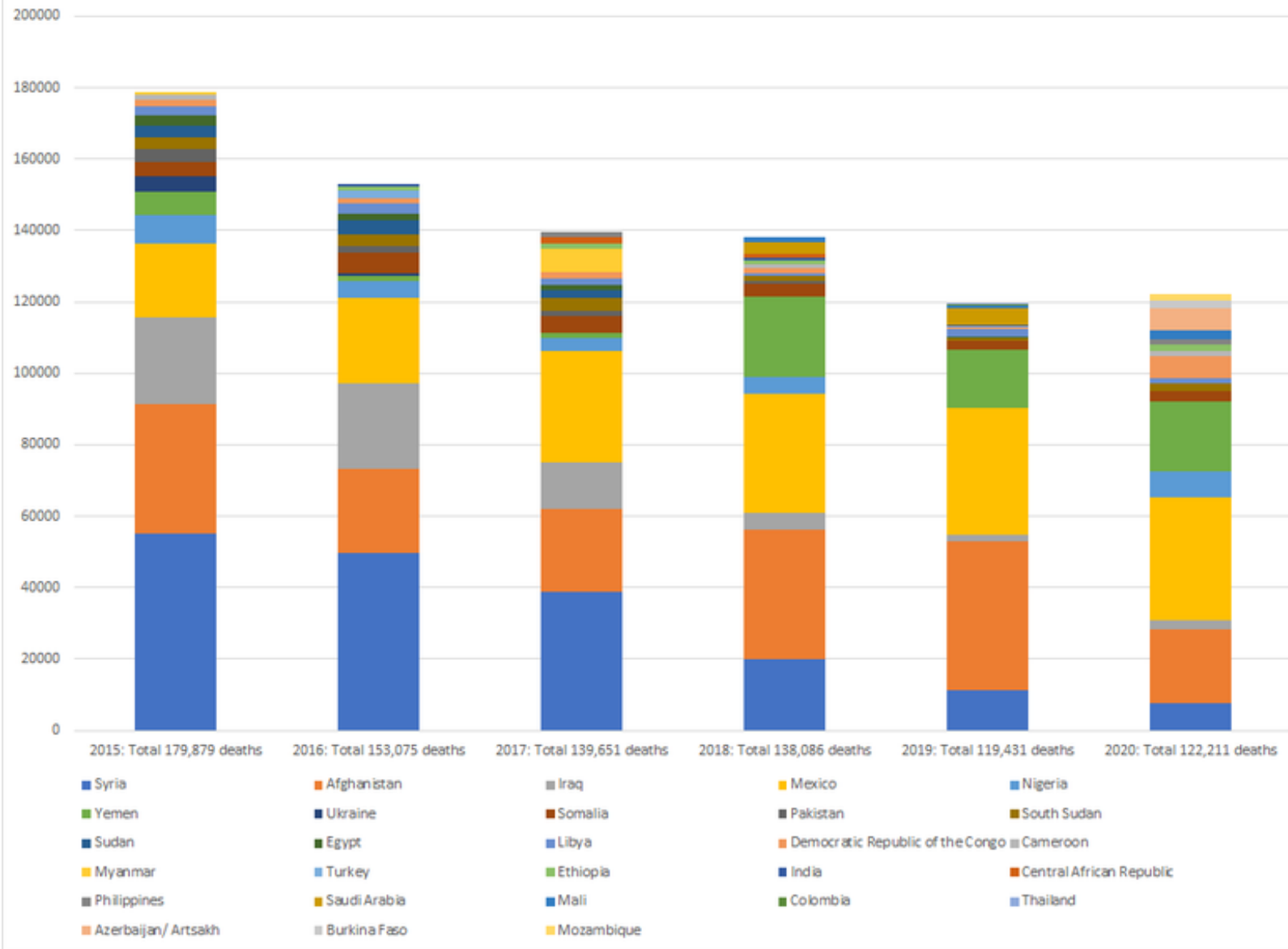
